0:10	Late 70s	Kingston	Peter was involved with local politics. Peter was upset with the government and in 1978 he “entered the race”. He lost the elections to one of his friends, Jimmy Clock.
0:37	Early 80s	Kingston	A few years later, Mr. Dave Traverse retired, and his brother decided to run. Peter decided to run against his brother: he didn’t think Mr. Traverse would win.
0:58			Before the elections Dave's Traverse brother broke his legs falling from an apple tree. Peter thought he could win the elections.
1:31			He went door to door, but he lost by 37 votes to a person with two broken legs, he jokes. That is when he decided to step back from politics and focus on business. And Thank God for that, he says, because he has done very well in business.
